FELLOWSHIPS AND ASSISTANTSHIPS AT UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA AMERICAN STUDIES PROGRAM [WU#221]



Graduate Fellowships and Teaching Assistantships are available to support graduate international students at the University of South Florida American Studies Program. All students accepted will receive positions as teaching assistants, if they wish, provided that they have minimum TOEFL scores of: Reading: 20; Writing: 24; Listening: 20; Speaking: 24.

Teaching assistantships include a tuition waiver and a stipend. This stipend is \$3300 per semester in the first year and \$5800 per semester in the second year, and there are three teaching semesters per year. In addition, the applicant entering in the fall of 2012 who scores highest on the GRE will receive a one-year, \$10,000 fellowship. The tuition waiver does not include the waiver of student fees, which amount to approximately \$3000 per year; and the cost of living in Tampa is estimated at \$14,000 per year.

The University of Baltimore School of Law offers a Master of Laws program in the Law of the United States (LL.M. LOTUS). This nine-month degree program is designed for law graduates who earned their first degree in law outside the U.S. and seek to become familiar with American law and the legal system. Students educated in Brazil, Cameroon , China, Kenya, India, Iran, Nigeria, Pakistan, Romania, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, and Venezuela are currently enrolled. The School of Law provides a robust week-long orientation, excellent education with academic support services, and connection with its large alumni network in the Baltimore/Washington, D.C. area.

Each year, the School of Law offers partial scholarships to a small number of LL.M. students who have demonstrated outstanding academic achievement. In 2010-2011, five of our 19 new students have been awarded partial scholarships. The School of Law is now accepting applications for admission to the 2011-12 LL.M. LOTUS program. Applicants who seek a merit scholarship indicate that fact on their application and feature their academic and professional achievements in their statement of purpose and resume. ENTRANCE EXAM REQUIREMENTS

Maryland Institute requires a minimum score of 550 PBT or 80 iBT on the TOEFL test for full admission into the program. Conditional admission may be granted to applicants otherwise acceptable with scores of at least 69 on iBT TOEFL or 5.5 on IELTS. Conditionally accepted students may either submit higher scores by a given deadline, or complete a 3-week summer Intensive English Program on the MICA campus just prior to enrolling full time at the college.

DAVID JACOBS'61 INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR VISUAL ARTS (one award)

The recipient of this award will receive \$30,000 per year for each year of undergraduate study at MICA. To be eligible, candidates must be citizens of a foreign country and be living outside the US. The scholarship award will be applied toward the cost of tuition, fees and books/art supplies. The recipient should be prepared to find funding for additional costs to cover room and board, personal and transportation expenses each year. Estimated total expenses for the 2011-2012 academic year are \$52,476.

INTERNATIONAL AWARD OF EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP (one award)

The recipient of this award will receive \$10,000 per year for each year of undergraduate study at MICA. To be eligible, candidates must be citizens of a foreign country and be living outside the US. The scholarship award will be applied toward the cost of tuition, fees and books/art supplies. The recipient should be prepared to find funding for additional costs to cover room and board, personal and transportation expenses each year, estimated at \$42,476 for the 2011-2012 academic year.

C.V. STARR SCHOLARSHIP (fifteen awards)

Fifteen students will be selected to receive this scholarship, which will award \$2,500 per year for four years in recognition of outstanding artistic ability and talent. To be eligible, candidates must be citizens of a foreign country but may be studying either in the US or abroad. The scholarship is intended for students seeking to earn their first undergraduate degree. The scholarship award will be applied toward the cost of tuition at the MICA. The recipient should be prepared to find funding for the remaining costs of attendance, estimated at \$49,976 for the 2011-2012 academic year.

SOUTHERN OREGON UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL CULTURAL SERVICES PROGRAM UP TO \$9000 IN GRANTS [WU#224]



The Southern Oregon University (SOU) International Cultural Services Program (ICSP) provides approximately 20 international undergraduate and graduate students with grants of about \$9000 USD per academic year (\$3,000 USD per term) toward tuition at SOU. Partial grants are sometimes awarded. Once accepted to this competitive program, students who perform satisfactorily are normally able to continue with ICSP support until they complete their program at SOU.

A unique factor of this grant is "cultural service". Students participating in the program devote some 3 hours per week (80 hours per academic year) to volunteer service, usually consisting of making presentations about their countries and cultures in local schools.

In order to qualify, please note that:

- The full range of criteria that one would expect will be considered, including academic excellence as demonstrated by grades and other achievement (minimum GPA is 2.75 for undergraduate and 3.0 for graduate students), the student's own written application, an interview when possible, and letters of recommendation. Demonstration of financial need is also taken into consideration.
- For ICSP grants, those selected must also have excellent and clear spoken English and the ability to represent their country effectively in public. For both programs, we also strive to achieve some geographical balance in participation.

Each year a limited number of need-based financial aid grants are offered to international students (non-U.S. citizens) in the incoming class. Grant recipients will generally continue to receive aid in the following years. International students who do not receive financial aid their first year will generally not be assisted in following years, unless funds permit. The average award this year was \$34,460.

In addition, international students can be considered for all merit scholarships, except the Army ROTC scholarship program and National Merit Scholarships.
