Expected results:

Proposition of transdisciplinary solutions to the human conglomerates discussing cultural social and economic aspects using the Brazilian and European experience. These proposals will be forwarded to the Brazilian and the European authorities to contribute in the elaboration of public policies.

Structure of Conference:

It will consist of four panels that will serve as input to produce a document of suggestions to be presented in the last session of the conference. The panels will cover the quality of life, public policy, experiments in progress, and integration between parliament and the executive bodies. In the final panel the results of each panel will be discussed in order to provide material for the conference conclusions to be sent to Brazilian and European authorities.
